#### Minutes of Port Commission Regular Meeting December 16, 2021 In Person & Videoconference

A Regular Meeting of the Port Commission of Port Freeport was held December 16, 2021, beginning at 1:11 PM at the Administration Building, 1100 Cherry Street, Freeport, Texas.

Commissioner Hoss noted the following information that was included on the posted agenda.

- 5. Public Comment Mr. Bobby Fuller addressed the Port Commission and staff thanking them for 10 years of support through the proceeds of the annual golf tournament.
- 6. Approval of minutes from the Regular Meeting held November 17.

A motion was made by Commissioner Croft to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Santos with all Commissioners present voting in favor of the motion.

7. Presentation of check to Texas Port Ministry from proceeds of Port Freeport Golf Tournament.

Ms. Saathoff stated that on October 18, Port Freeport hosted its 10<sup>th</sup> annual golf tournament benefiting Texas Port Ministry at The Wilderness in Lake Jackson. A total of 135 players,

over 75 sponsors and more than 20 volunteers helped make the tournament a success. Ms. Saathoff thanked the Port Freeport staff and Texas Port Ministry staff for their efforts in volunteering and coordinating the tournament as well as Darlene Winkler, who organizes the event and the sponsorships. Ms. Saathoff also recognized the student volunteers from Texas A&M Galveston Maritime Organization who volunteer every year. The net total for the 2021 Port Freeport Golf Tournament was \$66,000. A check was presented to Mr. Bobby Fuller and staff of Texas Port Ministry. Mr. Fuller addressed members of the Board, Port employees and sponsors to thank them for their efforts and success of this tournament. He also introduced Chris Moore who will join the ministry in January 2022. Mr. Moore will be the next director for Texas Port Ministry after Mr. Fuller retires June 30.

At this time, Commissioner Hoss took care of a housekeeping item and asked if any Commissioners had a conflict with any item on the agenda. There were no conflicts noted.

Commissioner Pirtle also joined the meeting at this time.

8. Recognition, including but not limited to: Cordoba Law Firm and Port Employees.

Ms. Saathoff recognized Port Employees who recently received service awards. Randy Thompson and Jennifer Barrera both received their five-year award while Jason Hull celebrated ten years, Jesse Hibbetts fifteen years and Rodney Blackstock marking twenty years. Ms. Saathoff also recognized Al Durel and his operations team for their recent coordination and efforts with the arrival of the largest container vessel to call Port Freeport. This vessel was met with challenges, but the team worked together to fix the issue so work could continue, and the vessel could sail on schedule.

Ms. Saathoff also recognized Jason Cordoba and his staff who have always been extremely professional and done an outstanding job for the Port through the years. His team has always stepped up and been available to assist the Port when needed and will be missed as general counsel for the Port. Mr. Cordoba thanked the Port for the opportunity to be a part of Port Freeport team. Commissioners echoed Ms. Saathoff's sentiments in thanking Mr. Cordoba for his service.

9. Receive reports from Executive Staff on activities and matters related to COVID-19 health safety matters, administrative affairs, financial results, facility engineering matters, operations and vessel activity, port safety matters, port security matters, Port tenant updates, USCOE, and other related port affairs.

#### A. Executive Director/CEO

Ms. Saathoff reported the Port received the Corps' 2020 Fact Card which presents the foreign waterborne statistics for the nation, noting that Port Freeport moved from 15<sup>th</sup> in the nation to 11<sup>th</sup> in the nation in foreign waterborne, and moved up to 16<sup>th</sup> in the nation overall for total waterborne foreign and domestic tonnage. Ms. Saathoff reported on the Corps Quarterly Executive Committee meeting held December 7 and announced Sharon Tirpak will be retiring at the end of the year. She also reminded the Commission that Col. Vail will also be retiring in June 2022. The work for the widening of Reach 2 will begin in February and plans for the dry excavation work to be done in the bend is nearly complete and work is scheduled to begin in the Spring. Ms. Saathoff also reported the EPA has given approval for all remaining material to go to offshore placement, which

sets the Port up for awarding a single contract for the remaining work in the channel. Additionally, the Port is also in good position to compete for funds from the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act. Ms. Saathoff shared a photo of the 900-foot container vessel that called Port Freeport December 10. This was the vessel's first call to the U.S. from China and discharged approximately 618 boxes. Ms. Saathoff reported on a meeting held between the Velasco Drainage District, Brazoria County, the Port, Representative Vasut and Senator Huffman's office regarding the Sabine to Galveston project. She also reported on a meeting held with the Traffic Coordination & Safety Group to receive update on the TxDOT projects slated in and around the area. Ms. Saathoff noted there are still vacant positions for the Port posted on the website and staff is actively pursuing candidates to fill positions. Staff expects to have a signed NOAA Ports System Agreement on the agenda in January for approval.

#### B. Chief Financial Officer

Mr. Lowe gave a presentation regarding the financial results for the month of October.

#### C. Director of Engineering

In Mr. Hull's absence, Mr. Nick Malambri was available for questions regarding his submitted written report.

#### D. Director of Operations

Mr. Durel introduced Ms. Holly Soria who joined Operations earlier in the year. Additionally, he reported on vessel and cargo activity for the month of November and a portion of December. He noted the Port saw a vessel for Riviana in December and is scheduling more vessels for January / February. The Port is also seeing a lot of steel by way of ship, barge and rail as well as a significant increase in railcars. Total vehicles handled year to date is 17,136 with 6,323 containers and 545 railcars handled.

#### E. Director of Business & Economic Development

Mr. Miura stated that his department continues to execute on the strategic objectives and has seen a heightened number of inquiries about the Port. Additionally, the recent press releases related the Harbor Channel Improvement Project and dock construction has gain the attention of the market. Staff is working diligently to convert interest into actual business.

Commissioner Croft reported attending the Sweeny FFA Fundraiser, visit with folks from Riviana, Alliance meeting, Gary Basinger Retirement and the AAPA Commissioners Seminar held in San Diego.

Commissioner Santos reported attending the Vulcan Lockwood visit, Groundbreaking Ceremony at the Brazoria County Courthouse as well as Gary Basinger Retirement.

Commissioner Singhania reported attending the Basinger Retirement, AAPA Commissioners Seminar, Congressman Nehls' staff visit, Dow Christmas event, Vulcan Lockwood visit, Port Freeport CAP meeting and the G&H Towing Dock Christening event.

Commissioner Giesecke reported attending the 36A Breakfast, State of the Community and the Lockwood visit.

Commissioner Hoss reported attending the Lower Brazos River Coalition meeting, Velasco Drainage District meeting regarding coastal spine funding as well as the CAP meeting.

Mr. Durel presented the applications for stevedore license renewals and shared the spreadsheet and checklist used to ensure the stevedores have submitted all necessary information to meet requirements. Commissioner Singhania expressed his concern for the higher TIRR ratings asking what plans or proposals have been made to reduce incidents. Mr. Durel stated that staff has been meeting with them regularly to always improve safety. Mr. Charles Montgomery with ILA spoke to the Commission regarding safety training and strides made to improve safety and reduce incidents within the Port. Commissioner Pirtle noted that the OSS Advisory Committee discussed TIRR ratings as well, noting that should anyone have a five or higher rating, staff would review the reasons for the rating.

#### RESOLUTION APPROVING THE APPLICATION AND TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT FOR FREEPORT LNG DEVELOPMENT, LP AND FLNG LIQUEFACTION 4, LLC FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN BRAZORIA COUNTY REINVESTMENT ZONE NO. 21-01

At a regular meeting of the Port Commission of Port Freeport of Brazoria County, Texas (the "Port") held at the office of the Port at 1100 Cherry Street, Freeport, Texas, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2022, among other business, on motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was passed and adopted:

#### FINDINGS

- 1. Due and proper notice of the date, time, place and purpose of this meeting has been duly given in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, and such meeting has been conducted in accordance with said Open Meetings Act.
- 2. Port Freeport ("Port") has heretofore adopted guidelines and criteria for granting tax abatement in a reinvestment zone in Brazoria County, Texas.
- 3. A Tax Abatement Agreement for property located in the Brazoria County Reinvestment Zone No. 21-01 was entered into by and between Brazoria County and Freeport LNG Development, LP and FLNG Liquefaction 4, LLC on March 23, 2021.
- 4. Section 312.206(a) of Subchapter B of the Texas Property Redevelopment and Tax Abatement Act, V.A.T.S. Tax Code, Chapter 312 and other applicable sections of said statute, provide that if property taxes are abated within the taxing jurisdiction of a municipality, the governing body of any other taxing unit in which the property is located may execute a written agreement with such owner of the property.
- 5. The Port Commission herenow finds and determines that the property subject to the following proposed agreement meets the applicable guidelines and criteria adopted by the governing body of the Port: TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN BRAZORIA COUNTY REINVESTMENT ZONE NO. 21-01.
- 6. The Port Commission finds and determines that the granting of this tax abatement to Freeport LNG Development, LP and FLNG Liquefaction 4, LLC will promote the development of industry within the Port boundaries, provides additional employment and strengthen the economy of the area, and is therefore in the best interest of the Port:

Freeport LNG Development, LP and FLNG Liquefaction 4, LLC is evaluating the construction of Train 4 at their Quintana Liquefaction facility.

#### Tax abatement considerations:

- \$2,403,472,500 investment
- Ten year term of tax abatement (2023 through 2032)
- Estimated value of \$1,872,969,000 after abatement expires
- Permanent jobs created 45
- Construction jobs created 150 at start, 1200 at peak, 400 at finish

Brazoria County Commissioners' Court approved the application and agreement on March 23, 2021.

Staff recommends approval of a ten year term after conducting its assessment and confirming the following:

- The application is complete and the fee has been paid
- The application satisfies the criteria and the abatement is permitted under the Port's Guidelines and Criteria For Granting Tax Abatements
- FLNG has complied fully with its obligations to date
- FLNG is not liable to the Port for outstanding taxes or other obligations
- The agreement conforms to and is consistent with the agreement approved by the County

# TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT WITH FREEPORT LNG DEVELOPMENT, LP AND FLNG LIQUEFACTION 4, LLC FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN BRAZORIA COUNTY REINVESTMENT ZONE NO. 21-01

This Tax Abatement Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between **PORT FREEPORT** ("Port") and **FREEPORT LNG DEVELOPMENT**, **LP**, a Limited Partnership authorized to do business in Texas, and **FLNG LIQUEFACTION 4**, **LLC**, ("Owner"), the owner of taxable real property in Brazoria County, Texas, located in the **BRAZORIA COUNTY REINVESTMENT ZONE NO. 21-01** ("Reinvestment Zone").

#### I. AUTHORIZATION

**1.01** This Agreement is authorized by the Texas Property Redevelopment and Tax Abatement Act, V.A.T.S. Tax Code, Chapter 312, as amended, and by resolution of the Port Commission of Port Freeport approving this Abatement.

#### II. DEFINITIONS

- **2.01** As used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meanings set forth below:
- a. "<u>Certified Appraised Value</u>" means the January 1st appraised value of the property within the Reinvestment Zone as certified by the Brazoria County Appraisal District as of the January 1st valuation date.
- b. "<u>Abatement</u>" means the full or partial exemption from ad valorem taxes of certain property in a reinvestment zone designated for economic development purposes.
- c. "<u>Eligible Property</u>" means the buildings, structures, tangible personal property as defined in the Texas Tax Code including fixed machinery and equipment, process units, site improvements, and related fixed improvements necessary to the operation and administration of the facility.
- d. "New Eligible Property" means Eligible Property construction of which commences subsequent to the date of the Port approving the Tax Abatement. During the construction phase of the New Eligible Property, Owner may make such change orders to the New Eligible Property as are reasonably necessary to accomplish its intended use.
- e. "<u>Ineligible Property</u>" means land, existing improvements, tangible personal property that the Brazoria County Appraisal District classifies as inventory and supplies, tools, furnishings and other forms of movable personal property, vehicles, watercraft, aircraft, housing, convalescent homes, assisted living homes/centers, hotel accommodations,

retail facilities, deferred maintenance investments, property to be rented or leased except as provided in Section 2(f), tangible personal property located in the reinvestment zone prior to the effective date of this Agreement, property that is already subject to real or personal property tax moved from one location in Brazoria County to the reinvestment zone, real property with a productive life of less than 10 years, property owned or used by the State of Texas or its political subdivisions or by any organization owned, operated or directed by a political subdivision of the State of Texas, or any other property for which abatement is not allowed by State law.

- f. "<u>Actual Productive Life</u>" means the actual period of time the improvements were in active service and operation as part of a facility operating in a producing capacity, and this definition supersedes any other definition stated elsewhere.
- **2.02** The Guidelines And Criteria For Granting Tax Abatement In A Reinvestment Zone Created In Port Freeport In Brazoria County, Texas ("Port Guidelines And Criteria"), adopted by the Port Commission of Port Freeport, are attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and made a part hereof. All definitions set forth therein are applicable to this Agreement.

#### III. SUBJECT PROPERTY

- **3.01** The Reinvestment Zone is an area generally described as approximately 1,800 acres of land in Brazoria County, Texas. The legal description of the Reinvestment Zone is attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- **3.02** The Brazoria County Appraisal District has established the value for land, personal property and improvements of Owner in the subject property or of certain tracts of land from which the subject tract of land is derived as of January 1, 2020. The total appraised value is \$6,861,628,580.00 as indicated on the Brazoria County Appraisal District Certification attached hereto as Exhibit D.

#### IV. VALUE AND TERM OF ABATEMENT

- **4.01** This Tax Abatement shall be effective January 1, 2023 and shall continue for a period of ten (10) years, or one-half (½) the productive life of the improvements, whichever is less. One hundred percent (100%) of the value of New Eligible Properties shall be abated subject to Section 4.03 herein below.
- **4.02** Pursuant to the above-provisions and subject to Section 4.03 herein below, the term of abatement under this Agreement shall commence January 1, 2023 and continue through December 31, 2032. The benefits of abatement shall continue throughout the last year in which abatement is applied as long as the property and property owner continue to qualify for abatement throughout the last year.

- 4.03 If pursuant to the above Section 4.01, it is determined upon completion of improvements, or at any time thereafter (including after the term of abatement otherwise granted under this Agreement) that one-half (½) the productive life of improvements is less than the term of years of abatement under this Agreement, the term of abatement shall be reduced to one-half (½) the productive life of the improvements and Owner shall pay to the Port the full amount of taxes otherwise abated in each year in which the term of abatement exceeded one-half (½) of the actual productive life of the improvements. The amount of taxes for part of a year, if applicable, shall be determined by proration (by multiplying the amount of abated taxes for the entire year by a fraction, the denominator of which is 365 and the numerator of which is the number of days in excess of the term of abatement represented by one-half (½) of the actual productive life of the improvements). Any recapture hereunder shall be payable within sixty (60) days of written notice. Owner shall certify by statement to the Port and the Brazoria County Appraisal District the estimated productive life of improvements upon completion of the construction; provided, however Owner's estimate of productive life shall not control the operation of this subsection.
- **4.04** The payment obligation under Section 4.03 is a continuing obligation. Owner understands and agrees that this Agreement mandates that Owner's abated improvements be in active service and operation as part of a facility operating in a producing capacity for a period of twenty (20) years from the effective commencement date of this agreement (to December 31, 2042) in order for Owner to receive ten (10) full years of abatement that are not subject to the term reduction and recapture/payment obligation provisions of Section 4.03 of this Agreement.

#### V. TAXABILITY

- **5.01** During the period that this Tax Abatement is effective, taxes shall be payable as follows:
- (a) The value of Ineligible Property shall be fully taxable;
- (b) the Certified Appraised Value of existing Eligible Property as determined each year shall be fully taxable; and
- (c) the value of New Eligible Property shall be abated as set forth in Section IV herein.

#### VI. PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS AND EMPLOYMENT

**6.01** As set forth in the Application attached as Exhibit A, Owner represents that it will construct a liquefied natural gas import and regasification terminal. The estimated value of eligible improvements to be owned by Owner at the end of this Agreement indicated in the application is \$1,872,969,000.00.

- **6.02** The Owner represents and warrants that this project will create 45 full-time jobs for employees to be employed at Owner. In addition, Owner represents and warrants that the level of employment stated in the abatement application (including the projected creation or retention of employment) will be maintained for the duration of the abatement period. It is further represented that this project will provide an estimated 150 construction jobs at the beginning of construction, with a peak load of 1200 construction jobs during the course of construction and 400 such jobs upon completion.
  - 6.03 All improvements shall be completed in accordance with all applicable law.
- **6.04** The Owner shall not make any use of the property that is inconsistent with the general purpose of encouraging development or redevelopment of the reinvestment zone during the period that the property tax exemptions are in effect.
- **6.05** The Owner estimated in its application that construction of the improvements will begin in March of 2022 with completion estimated in the first quarter of 2026.

#### VII. EVENT OF DEFAULT

- **7.01** During the abatement period covered by this Agreement, the Port may declare a default hereunder by the Owner if:
  - (a) the Owner fails to commence construction of the new facility described in Section VI above, and the Application attached hereto as Exhibit A within two (2) years from the date this Agreement is executed;
  - (b) the Owner fails to construct the new facility described in Section VI above;
  - (c) the Owner refuses or neglects to comply with any of the terms of this Agreement;
  - (d) any representation made by the Owner in this Agreement is false or misleading in any material respect; or
  - (e) the constructed facility fails to meet the economic qualifications of Section 2(h) of the Port Guidelines and Criteria. The economic qualifications of Section 2(h) therein expressly include the requirement that the level of employment stated in the Application for the property that is the subject of the Tax Abatement Agreement be maintained for the duration of the abatement period.
- 7.02 Should the Port determine the Owner to be in default of this Agreement, the Port shall notify the Owner in writing prior to the end of the abatement period, and if such default is not cured within sixty (60) days from the date of such notice ("Cure Period"), then this Agreement may be terminated; provided, however, that in the case of a default for causes beyond Owner's reasonable control cannot with due diligence be cured within such sixty-day period, the Cure Period shall be deemed extended if Owner (i) shall immediately, upon the receipt of such notice, advise the Port of Owner's intention to institute all steps necessary to cure such default and (ii) shall institute and thereafter prosecute to completion with reasonable dispatch all steps necessary to cure same.

- 7.03 In the event the Owner allows its ad valorem taxes owed the Port to become delinquent and fails to timely and properly follow the legal procedures for their protest and/or contest, or if the Owner defaults and/or violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and fails to cure during the Cure Period, this Agreement may then be terminated and all taxes previously abated by virtue of this Agreement will be recaptured and paid within sixty (60) days of termination.
- 7.04 In the event the facility contemplated herein is completed and begins producing product or service, but the Owner fails to maintain the level of employment (including the projected creation or retention of employment) set forth in Section 6.02, the Port may elect to: (a) Declare a default and terminate this Agreement without recapturing prior years' abated taxes; (b) Declare a default, terminate this Agreement and order a recapture of all or part of the previous years' abated taxes; (c) Set specific terms and conditions for the continuation of the abatement exemption for the duration of the term of this Agreement under its present terms or alter the amount of the abatement for the remaining term of this Agreement; or (d) Order recapture pursuant to the provisions of Section 4.03 of this Agreement, if applicable.

#### VIII. ADMINISTRATION

- **8.01** This Agreement shall be administered on behalf of the Port by its Chief Financial Officer. The Owner shall allow authorized employees and/or representatives of the Port who have been designated and approved by the Port to have access to this Reinvestment Zone during the term of this Agreement to inspect the facility to determine compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. All inspections will be made at a mutually agreeable time after the giving of forty-eight (48) hours prior notice and will only be conducted in such manner as to not unreasonably interfere with the construction and/or operation of the facility. All inspections will be made with one or more representatives of the Owner and in accordance with the Owner's safety standards.
- **8.02** Upon completion of the contemplated construction, the Chief Financial Officer and/or other persons appointed by the Port shall annually evaluate the facility to ensure compliance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement and shall report possible defaults to the Port Commission of Port Freeport.
- **8.03** The Chief Appraiser of the Brazoria County Appraisal District annually shall determine (a) the taxable value pursuant to the terms of this abatement of the real and personal property comprising this Reinvestment Zone and (b) the full taxable value without abatement of the real and personal property comprising this Reinvestment Zone. The Chief Appraiser shall record both the abated taxable value and the full taxable value in the appraisal records. The full taxable value figure listed in the appraisal records shall be used to compute the amount of abated taxes that are required to be captured and paid in the event this Agreement is terminated in a manner that results in recapture. Each year Owner shall furnish the Chief Appraiser with such information outlined in Chapter 22, V.A.T.S. Tax Code, as may be necessary for the administration of the abatement specified herein.

8.04 If the Port terminates this Agreement, it shall provide Owner written notice of such termination. If Owner believes that such termination was improper, Owner may file suit in the Brazoria County District Courts appealing such termination within ninety (90) days after receipt from the Port of written notice of the termination. If an appeal suit is filed, Owner shall remit to the Port, within sixty (60) days after receipt of the notice of termination, any additional and/or recaptured taxes as may be payable during the pendency of the litigation pursuant to the payment provisions of Section 42.08 V.A.T.S. Tax Code. If the final determination of the appeal increases Owner's tax liability above the amount of tax paid, Owner shall remit the additional tax to the Port pursuant to Section 42.42 V.A.T.S. Tax Code. If the final determination of the appeal decreases the Owner's tax liability, the Port shall refund to the Owner the difference between the amount of tax paid and the amount of tax for which the Owner is liable pursuant to Section 42.43, V.A.T.S. Tax Code.

#### IX. INFORMATION PROVIDED BY OWNER

- **9.01** Pursuant to Section 5(a)(7) of the Port Guidelines And Criteria, Owner shall annually furnish information necessary for Port's evaluation of Owner's compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the Port Guidelines And Criteria (in the form of an annual report/statement of compliance to be mailed to the Chief Financial Officer of the Port on or before January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year of the tax abatement contract term).
- **9.02** Additionally, Owner shall furnish the following information or written statements to the Port upon request during the term of this Agreement:
  - (a) Statement by Owner certifying the commencement and/or completion date of the contemplated improvements described in Section VI herein and in the abatement application;
  - (b) Statement by Owner of the number of permanent employees, contract employees and construction employees actually employed at the facility location;
  - (c) Statement by Owner describing the status of construction of the contemplated improvements, percentage of construction completed, construction schedule, and an estimate of taxable value of constructed improvements on the date of the statement; or
  - (d) In lieu of the above statements, Owner may furnish documents and records verifying the above requested information.
  - (e) Any information, documents or records of any kind reasonably necessary for the Port's evaluation of Owner's compliance with the terms and conditions of this agreement and the Port Guidelines and Criteria, provided that Owner shall not be required to furnish any information, documents or records which a reasonably prudent Owner or company under

the same or similar circumstances would consider to be harmful to its business operations.

- 9.03 Owner's statements described above shall be verified by the project manager or other appropriate official. Failure to provide any requested statement or information without just cause within sixty (60) days of the request or presentation of any false or misleading statement may at the Port's option, be construed as a default by Owner under this Agreement and cause for immediate termination of this Agreement and recapture of all previously abated taxes, if after written notice of default, Owner has not cured such default prior to the expiration of thirty (30) days from such written notice. The Cure Period provisions of Section VII are not applicable to a default and termination under this paragraph.
- 9.04 Owner has a continuing obligation for a period of twenty (20) years from the effective commencement date of this Agreement (to December 31, 2042) to report to the Port any plant closure or permanent cessation of production at the abated facility and to furnish to the Port upon request a written confirmation as to whether or not the abated improvements are in service as part of a producing facility or, if applicable, a statement of the beginning and ending dates of production from and/or the beginning and ending dates of operation of the abated facility improvements; or to provide other similar information necessary to determine the actual or estimated productive life of the abated improvements.
- 9.05 Pursuant to Section 5(a)(8) and Section 7(e) of the Port Guidelines and Criteria, Owner shall, upon expiration of this Agreement, begin annually reporting the status of the abated improvements regarding active service and operation as part of a facility operating in a producing capacity. Reporting will be for the same amount of years as the tax abatement period and in the form of a "Productive Life Report" to be mailed to the Chief Financial Officer of the Port on or before January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year for ten (10) years following the expiration of the tax abatement contract.

#### X. INDEMNIFICATION

10.01 Owner agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Port, its Port Commission, officers and employees from and against all obligations, claims, demands and causes of action of every kind and character (including the amounts of judgments, penalties, interest, court costs and legal fees incurred in defense of same) arising in favor of other governmental entities and agencies or third parties (including employees of Owner) as a result of or arising out of, the covenants to be performed by Owner under this Agreement, or any rights and provisions granted in this Agreement.

#### XI. ASSIGNMENT

11.01 Owner may assign this Agreement to a new owner or lessee of the same facility upon the approval by resolution of the Port Commission of Port Freeport subject to the financial capacity of the assignee and provided that all conditions and obligations in this Agreement are guaranteed by the execution of a new contractual agreement with the Port. No assignment or transfer shall be approved if

the parties to the existing agreement or the new owner or new lessees are liable to the Port or any affected jurisdiction for outstanding taxes or other obligations. Approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

## XII. ANNUAL PAYMENT TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND

**12.01** Intentionally left blank.

#### XIII. MODIFICATION OR TERMINATION

13.01 At any time before the expiration of this Agreement the parties may, upon mutual consent, modify or terminate the original agreement. Such modification or termination shall be done in accordance with Property Redevelopment and Tax Abatement Act, V.A.T.S., Chapter 312, Section 312.208 of Subchapter B.

#### XIV. AUTHORITY OF AGENT

14.01 By acceptance of this Agreement and/or any benefits conferred hereunder, Owner represents that its undersigned agents have complete and unrestricted authority to enter into this Agreement and to obligate and bind Owner to all of the terms, covenants and conditions contained in this Agreement.

#### XV. NOTICE

15.01 Any notice required to be given under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be duly served when it shall have been deposited, enclosed in a wrapper with the proper postage prepaid thereon, and duly registered or certified, return receipt requested, in a United States Post Office, addressed to the Port or Owner at the following addresses. If mailed, any notice or communications shall be deemed to be received three days after the date of deposit in the United States Mail. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, all notices shall be delivered to the following addresses:

16.01 The Port executes this Agreement by and through the Chairman of the Port Commission acting pursuant to a resolution approved by the Port Commission of Port Freeport, so authorizing, and the effective execution date of this Agreement is the date of the countersignature of the Chairman of the Port Commission.

This Agreement has been executed by the parties in multiple originals, each having full force and effect.

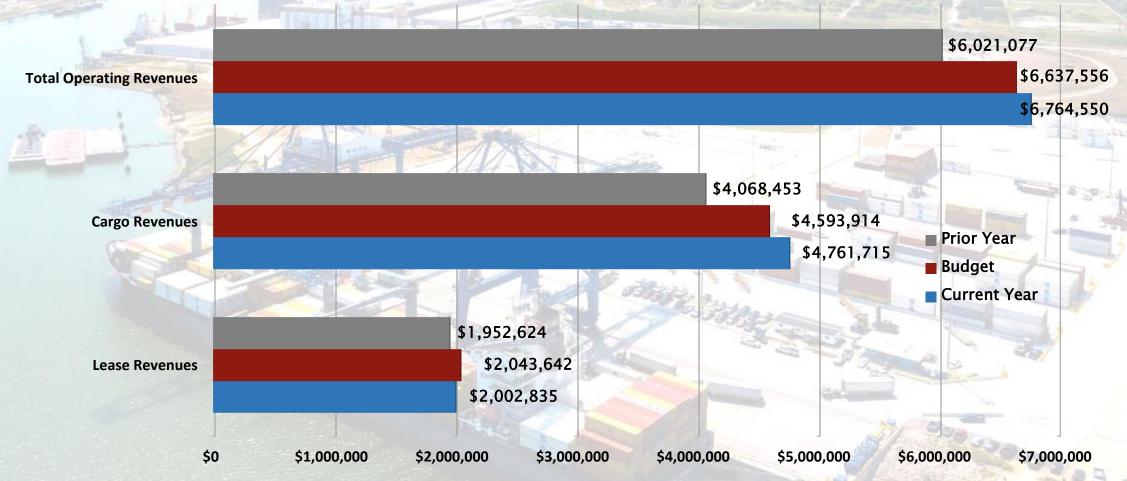






# FY 2022 YTD OPERATING REVENUES



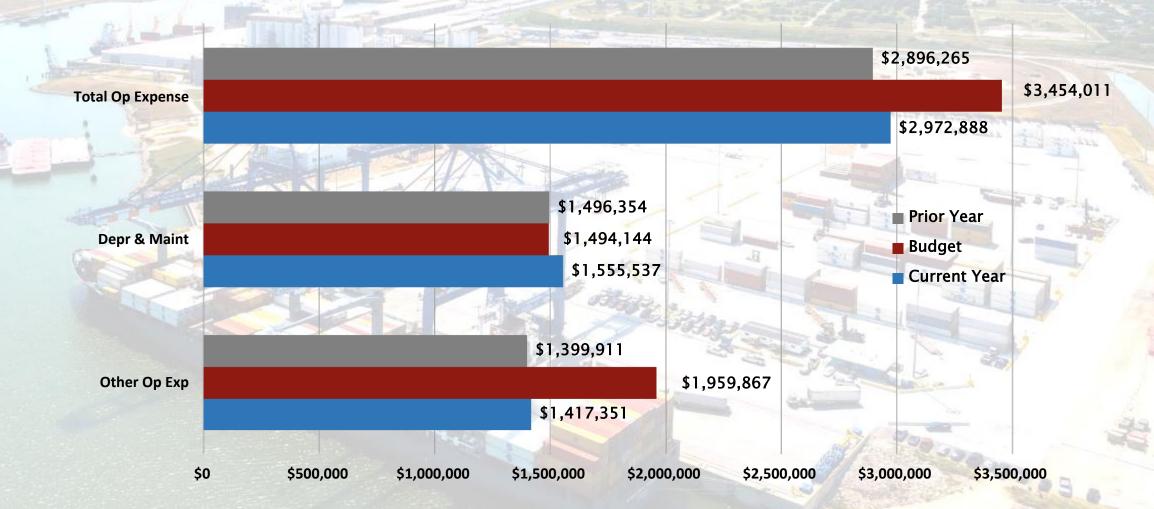

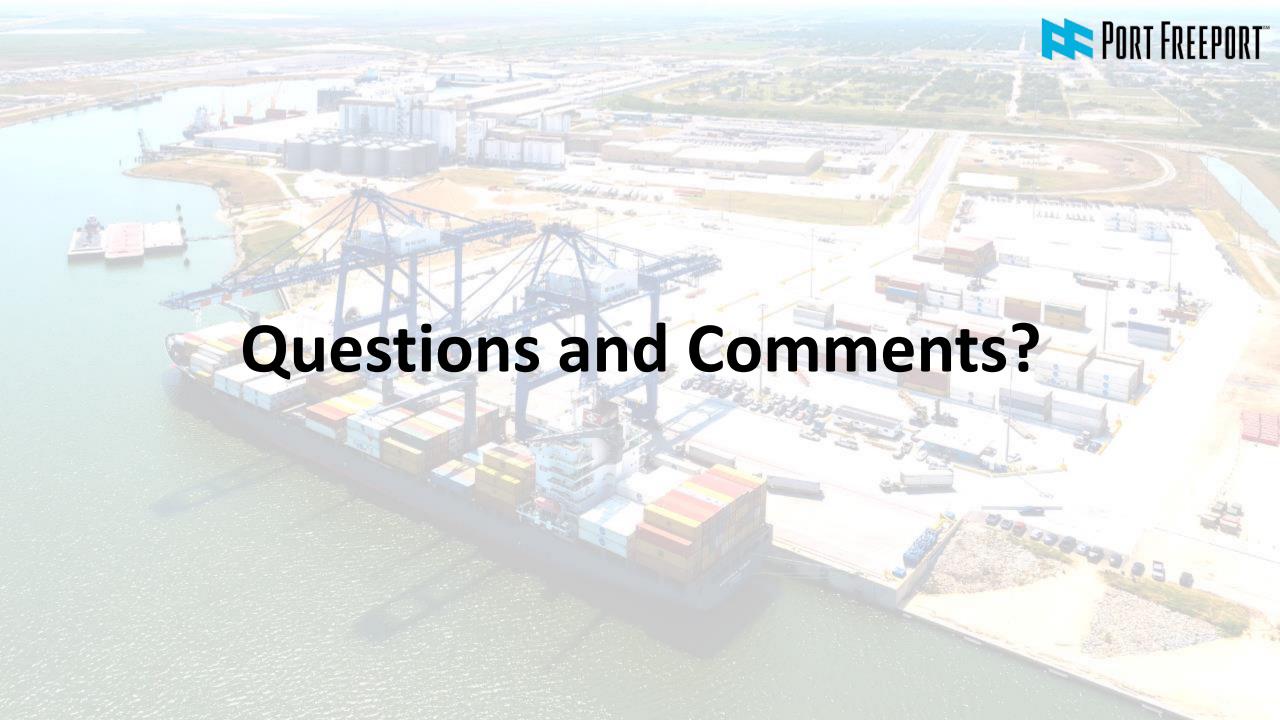

### Management Narrative

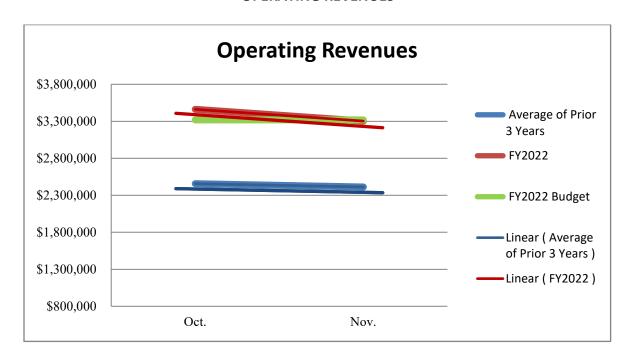
For the first two months of Fiscal Year 2022, the Port continued to remain on a positive financial foundation with operating revenues 2% above planned levels. Further, operating expenses were under planned levels and are below budget by a factor of 14%. These factors combined have contributed to producing an operating profit of \$3,791,662 and an operating margin of 56%, which is above planned performance levels by 19% or \$608,117 and is \$666,850 or 21% above prior year's results.

The Port's overall position remains strong as evidenced in a current ratio (unrestricted) of 5.5 to 1, which reflects a strong liquidity position, and a debt ratio of 110.5% which is supported by our strong credit rating. The following table provides additional summary level information.

#### **OPERATING REVENUES**



**Total operating revenues** for the period ending November 30, 2021, are \$6,764,550. This is \$126,994 or 2% above planned levels. The following provide more specific explanations for variances in revenue:

**Wharfage** revenue stands at \$2,198,996, which is under budget by \$69,052 or 3%. The following is a brief analysis of wharfage results by cargo category:

**Dockage** revenue stands at \$1,335,668, consistent with wharfage revenues, which is \$24,984 or 2% above budgeted levels. Year-to-date ship calls are 88 compared to a budget of 90.

**Equipment use fees,** stands at \$175,862, which is under budget \$37,102 or 17% due to decreased crane and equipment usage.

**Security fees**, consistent with wharfage and dockage, stand at \$451,026, which is over budget \$16,306 or 4%.

**Facility use fees** are \$231,093. This is over budget by \$39,423 or 21% due to facility usage outside of tenant leased areas.

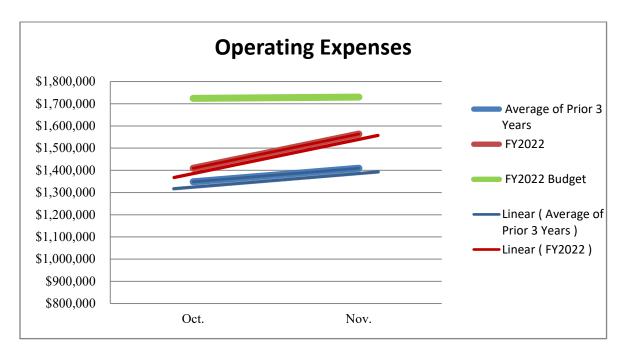
**Other customer service fees** (Port service charges, incidental services, customer re-bills, water, etc.) are \$367,459 which is \$191,631 or 109% above budgeted levels due to customer rebilling.

Ground leases stand at \$1,857,370, which is \$28,812 or 2% below budget levels.

Other leases are \$145,465, which is \$11,995 or 8% below budget levels.

**Other revenue** is \$1,611, which is \$1,611 above budgeted levels.

#### **OPERATING EXPENSES**



**Total operating expenses** are \$2,972,888, which is under budget \$481,123 or 14% for the period ended November 30, 2021. Following are more specific explanations for variances in operating expenses:

**Port salaries/wages and benefits** are \$616,345. This is \$244,064 or 28% less than budget. Currently, there are two vacancies when compared to Fiscal Year 2022 Budget.

**Professional services** are \$339,046, which is under budget \$108,522 or 24% due to timing of services. Security services, at \$286,982 is the majority of this budget item and is 2% below budgeted levels.

**Training, travel & promotional** expenses are \$50,363 which is under budget \$95,137 or 65%. Following is a brief explanation of some sub-categories within this line item:

- Commercial advertising is \$44,710, which is above budgeted levels \$19,280 or 75% due to timing
  of advertisements.
- Sales/promotional travel costs are \$3,797 which is under budgeted levels by \$6,127 or 62% due to timing of travel.
- Governmental relations costs are \$429 which is below budget by \$7,316 or 94% due to timing of government related travel.
- Community events are (\$37,125) which is below budgeted levels due the October Port
  Freeport Charitable Golf Tournament donations in which the expenses have not been paid
  including the check to Texas Port Ministries which will be cut in December.
- Technical training is \$1,624 which is \$18,118 or 92% under budget due to timing or postponement of training.

Supplies are \$23,278 which is \$8,008 or 26% below budget.

**Utilities** at \$66,129 are under budget \$67,299 or 50% due to the timing of the receipt of the bill and related customer rebilling.

**Business insurance** is \$240,837, which is \$355 or slightly above budgeted levels.

Other services and charges at \$81,353 are \$19,841 or 20% below budget due to the timing of annual dues and subscriptions.

**Maintenance and repair** expenses at \$247,099 are \$43,571 or 21% below budget. It should be noted that there are some customer damaged property repairs, which is offset by other services and charges revenue for the rebilling to the customer for the damages. There has not been any out of the ordinary expenses for repairs.

**Depreciation** expense at \$1,308,438 is \$17,822 or 1% above budget levels due to timing of additions.

**Operating income** is \$3,791,662 compared to a total fiscal year budget of \$18,424,600, shows a positive result for Fiscal Year 2022.

NON-OPERATING REVENUES (EXPENSES)

Ad Valorum tax collections are posted utilizing the certified appraised values. Adjustments are made throughout the year from the tax office reports to reflect appraisal and tax office adjustments as well as prior year collections and penalty and interest. Year to date values are \$6,310,931 compared to an annual budget of \$6,422,200.

**Investment income** is \$150,871 or 202% above budget due to change in fair market values and low interest rates. Investment rates conditions continue to be flat.

**Debt interest and fees** are \$1,567,397, which is \$48,543 or 3% above budgeted levels due to the budget amount being evenly distributed over twelve months.

Capital Contributions to Others budget includes \$31,050,000 in contributions to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the Freeport Harbor Channel Improvement Project, \$2,000,000 for the Berth 2 floodwall modifications and \$50,000 in contributions to the Port for cost share of improvements. There has been \$221,583 in expenses/revenue for these projects.

**Grant Revenue** budgeted for the Fiscal Year 2022 is \$375,000. There has been no in grant revenue for Fiscal Year 2022. The grant revenue is funded on a reimbursement basis, so the capital contributions are recorded when the expenditures for each project are reported quarterly.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AGREEMENTS RELATED TO THE NOAA FREEPORT PHYSICAL OCEANOGRAPHIC REAL-TIME SYSTEM

At the regular meeting of the Port Commission of Port Freeport held at the Administration Building of Port Freeport at 1100 Cherry Street, Freeport, Texas, on January 13, 2022, among other business, on motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was passed and adopted:

- 2. The Port has been working with local stakeholders, including the Brazos Pilots, to determine the need for real time oceanic and atmospheric data collection.

The U.S. Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), National Ocean Service, through the Center for Operational Oceanographic Products and Services (hereafter referred to as "CO-OPS") has prepared an Unfunded Agreement (the "CO-OPS Agreement") to establish the requirements for NOAA to receive and distribute data from the Freeport Physical Oceanographic Real Time System, hereafter referred to as Freeport PORTS® (FRPORTS®). PORTS® is a program that supports safe and cost-efficient navigation by providing ship masters, pilots, and other users with accurate real-time information required for safe vessel loading and transit, and to avoid groundings and collisions.
- 4. Freeport LNG Development, L.P. has agreed to pay the full cost of procurement, construction and installation of the two current meters (the "<u>Current Meter Systems</u>") required under the terms of the CO-OPS Agreement and to reimburse Port Freeport for costs incurred in the operation, maintenance and management of the Current Metering Systems for the first two years after completion and installation of the Current Meter Systems, as set forth in a letter agreement dated January 13, 2022 (the "<u>FLNG Letter Agreement</u>").
- 5. After review and consideration of the CO-OPS Agreement and the FLNG Letter Agreement (collectively, the "<u>Agreements</u>"), the Port Commission finds and determines that the terms of the Agreements are acceptable, and execution of the Agreements should be approved.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the form and substance of the proposed Agreements be, and are hereby, authorized and approved; and
- **BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND RESOLVED**, that Phyllis Saathoff, Executive Director/CEO of Port Freeport be, and is hereby, singularly authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Agreements, substantially in the form presented at this meeting and with such nonmaterial changes as may be approved by the official executing same, their execution thereof to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.
