Scholarships:

No child is turned away because of inability to pay. It is 100% at the schools' discretion to determine financial hardship. Please indicate scholarshipped students as "paid" in the paid column of the Registration Form. Showdown is only interested in the total number of students to be scholarshipped, not who the individual students are.

Notes on Program Fees:

- The fee for the PE Program covers the lesson only. The lift ticket and rental equipment are included at no charge to the student, so regardless of whether they have their own equipment or a season pass, the fee is the same.
 - o **If your students is a Showdown Season Passholder,** we ask the schools to require them to participate in the PE Program under the same rules as everyone else. The point of the PE Program is to provide lessons based on students ability. Any skier or snowboarder can become a better skier or snowboarder & that is the point of this education. We have lessons for all skill levels and appreciate your support on this.
- Chaperone rates are available to one adult for every five students.
 - o Exceptions are granted for escorts of Special Needs Students.
- Home Schools are limited to one Teacher.
- Community Rates are available for other adults and family members who will be traveling with the school, but who are not Teachers or Chaperones. These individuals are not included in the school paperwork; they just declare themselves a "Community Member" at the ShedQuarters or Rental Shop and proceed through with the appropriate paperwork and payment.

Payment Options

Teacher Coordinator pays for their PE Day in a single transaction at ShedQuarters with a school check, school Purchase Order, Cash, Visa, Mastercard or Discover.

Regrading Food

- No outside lunches, crockpots/instant pots/rice cookers/etc. will be permitted in the lodge.
 However, if you choose to participate in the PE Student Lunch Program, students may eat in the lodge. Otherwise students will eat any outside food on the bus.

Students with Special Needs

COVID Dependent - At this time it's uncertain whether or not Eagle Mount will be available. Our partnership with Eagle Mount ensures that students with developmental or physical disabilities can enjoy skiing and snowboarding right alongside their friends. Any student who requires specialized assistance or one-on-one attention is eligible. Eagle Mount's services are not an additional cost. There is not always an Eagle Mount representative on site at Showdown, so **please contact Eagle Mount directly at 406.454.1449** at least one month prior to your visit to arrange for their services. Parents *must* sign an Eagle Mount liability release in addition to the Showdown Montana release.

Teacher/Chaperone Responsibilities

One teacher is the coordinator and does all communication with Hannah Patrick, our PE Coordinator. The other teachers assist the Teacher/Coordinator as needed. Chaperones are responsible for aiding students in getting dressed, retrieving and keeping track of rental equipment, ensuring that students make it to lessons on time, and supervising students when they are not in a lesson. Equipment and lift tickets will be provided to Chaperones <u>only after</u> all students have made their way through the stations and out to the lesson area. Chaperones are welcome to participate in lessons at no charge, so long as they are not disruptive and/or occupy a disproportionate amount of the instructor's time. Our first priority must be the students. Adults not willing to perform the duties listed above can pay Community Rates instead, and just go play for the day.
