On December 6, 2019, MLPB moderated a <u>MassHealth DSRIP TA Program "SWI</u> <u>Pop-Up"</u> on *Lessons from Other States: Creating Care Delivery Systems that Recognize and Respond to Member Priorities & Circumstances*. The event featured experts from MLPB's <u>2019 Spring Breakfast</u> and a lively dialogue on strategies to help operationalize a person-centered culture in accountable care delivery -- including integration of legal problem-solving strategies. Grantees meeting on **Making Sense of Recent Immigration Policy News: Best Practices for Partnering with Immigrant Families**. This training addressed planning for ICE raids, as well as navigating proposed changes to the public charge rule.

Legal Director JoHanna Flacks also presented on Nov 2 at the **Tufts Department** of Family Medicine Fall Refresher: *Strengthening and Sharing Your Skills with Learners*. As part of a new CME frontier, she covered DCF Investigations: Considerations for Providers to Support Families, outlining families' legal risks, rights and remedies over the course of this high-stakes interaction with child protection authorities.
