OVERCORRECTING

Overcorrecting is steering too hard in reaction to an event and losing control of your vehicle. For example, if you drift onto the shoulder and then turn the steering wheel suddenly to get back onto the road.



Overcorrecting can be deadly. It can result in a rollover or send your vehicle across other lanes of traffic.

When any part of your vehicle leaves the roadway, the best practice is to bring the vehicle to a controlled stop off the road. Take your foot off the accelerator, and do not slam on the brakes.

Stay alert and slow down to prevent the risk of overcorrecting.
