HUD Publishes Quarterly Regulatory Waivers

In a Federal Register notice today, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) published a list of the regulatory waivers that it granted during the second quarter of calendar year 2021. HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) did not grant any waivers during this quarter, although, as you know, the CARES Act notices did provide waivers during this time.

HUD Awards \$3.6 Million in Choice Neighborhoods Planning Grants

In a press release yesterday, HUD announced that it has awarded \$3.6 million to eight communities across the country to help create plans to redevelop severely distressed HUDassisted housing and revitalize neighborhoods.
