## HUD to Host Capital Fund Guidebook Training Webinars

HUD's Office of Capital Improvements (OCI) has announced that it will be hosting a series of six webinars on the Capital Fund Guidebook. 

## HUD Announces Assistance for Tennessee and Virginia Disaster Survivors

In two press releases yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced the implementation of federal disaster assistance to supplement state and local recovery efforts in the areas of <u>Tennessee</u> affected by a severe winter storm on February 3 to February 4, 2022, and to supplement Commonwealth, Tribal, and local recovery efforts in the areas of Virginia affected by a severe winter storm and snowstorm on January 2 to January 3, 2022.

Two presidential major disaster declarations issued on March 11, 2022, allow HUD to offer assistance to Commonwealth, tribal, state, and eligible local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of damaged facilities in impacted counties. Effective immediately, for both states, the Department will:

- Grant a <u>90-day moratorium</u> on foreclosures of FHA-insured homes
- Make mortgage insurance available under <u>HUD's Section 203(h)</u> program
- Make insurance available for both mortgages and home rehabilitation under HUD's Section 203(k) program
- Make information on housing providers and HUD programs available
- Provide flexibility to Community Planning and Development Grantees, which can apply for needed administrative flexibility in response to natural disasters. For more information on applying for a waiver or suspension of program requirements, contact your local CPD program office.
- · Provide flexibility to PHAs, which can apply for needed waivers and flexibilities for disaster relief and recovery. The Department also released Notice PIH 2021-34, which advises the public of HUD's expedited process for waivers and flexibilities from HUD regulatory and administrative requirements for various public housing and voucher programs.



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
