HUD Awards More than \$36 Million Under ROSS-SC Program

In a [press release](#) yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) announced that it has awarded \$36.9 million in grants to PHAs, public housing resident associations, Native American tribes, and nonprofit organizations across the nation to hire or retain service coordinators to help residents achieve economic and housing independence. The funding is provided under the Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency–Service Coordinators ([ROSS–SC](#)) program.

ROSS service coordinators work directly with residents to assess their needs and connect them with services and opportunities that promote self-sufficiency. They help residents to meet their professional, financial, health, and educational goals. Service coordinators also work with seniors and people with disabilities to ensure they receive the medical care and social support required to age in place.
