### U.S. Supreme Court Ends Eviction Moratorium

Yesterday the United States Supreme Court [ruled](#) to end a temporary stay on a lower court ruling seeking to invalidate the eviction moratorium implemented by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ([CDC](#)). According to the Supreme Court's [decision](#), the CDC did not have the authority to impose a nationwide order to temporarily halt evictions. "If a federally imposed eviction moratorium is to continue, Congress must specifically authorize it", the verdict stated. The justices granted a request by a group of landlords and realtors to lift the latest CDC [eviction moratorium announced](#) on August 3, 2021, which only applied to areas experiencing substantial or high levels of COVID-19 transmission and that was set to expire in October 3, 2021.

The White House has released a [fact sheet](#) that provides new actions to protect vulnerable tenants and landlords, including [steps](#) the [U.S. Department of Treasury](#) is taking to reinforce existing guidance and implement new policies to help grantees expedite Emergency Rental Assistance ([ERA](#)).

### HUD Awards Lead and Health Hazard Grants

In a [press release](#) yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) announced the recipients of nearly \$95 million to protect children and families from lead-based paint and home health hazards. Grants were awarded to 28 state and local government agencies under the [Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program](#). These grants also include more than \$12 million from HUD's [Healthy Homes supplemental funding](#) to help with housing-related health and safety hazards in addition to lead-based paint hazards.
