PIH Extends Deadline for 50058 Submissions

In an email to executive directors yesterday via HUD's Financial Management Division (FMD) **mailing list**, HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) announced that it has extended the deadline to submit any actions recorded on lines 2a and 2b of the form HUD-50058 or HUD-50058 MTW for the **CY 2021 Operating Fund Grant**.

The initial deadline was August 30, 2020, 60 days after the end of the CY 2021 operating fund grant reporting period (July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020). PIH extended the deadline from 60 days to 90 days for transactions impacted by waivers and alternative requirements described in Notice **PIH 2020-13, REV-1**. PHAs that implemented waivers and alternative described in such notice must correct data in IMS/PIC before **September 30, 2020**

As the email states, where a PHA cannot update or correct IMS/PIC data, the PHA must contact its field office, or if the field office cannot resolve the issue, the PHA must contact the Technical Assistance Center (TAC) for assistance and a PIC Ticket.

HUD Announces Expansion of MTW Demonstration

In a **press release** yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced that it is expanding its Moving to Work (MTW) demonstration, which invites 100 additional housing authorities to join the program over the next two-year period. MTW allows PHAs to practice greater program flexibility and encourages housing choice and self-sufficiency among low-income families.

Currently, there are 39 MTW PHAs throughout the nation. In 2015, Congress allowed HUD to expand the MTW demonstration program to 100 additional PHAs by 2022. With the publication of its final **operations notice** on August 28, 2020, HUD can now invite eligible PHAs to submit complete applications under the first two cohorts of the MTW expansion. Future cohorts will be announced soon. As the email states:

One hundred MTW PHAs will be added in five cohorts. Each cohort will experiment with a certain affordable housing policy, and HUD will study that policy change to learn what successful MTW innovations should be applied to all PHAs across the nation. Interested agencies should consider the types of policies they would like to implement as part of the demonstration program.
