



What is a Channel

- Available in 15.5 and higher, Channels allow you to access external sites, applications or classic PPM.
- The user gets visibility to other tools or classic PPM without leaving a Clarity project, streamlining work and business decisions.
- Configurable via blueprints, giving users flexibility depending on the project type. Each blueprint will allow you to configure up to 5 channels.



Recent Channel Updates

- With 15.9.1 Channels can now be used in:
 - Ideas
 - Custom Investments
 - Custom Objects
- Other enhancements to Channels in 15.9.1:
 - Supports input parameters for custom attributes of type Number, String and Single Value Lookups (Static and NSQL Based)
 - Channel limit increased to 15
- 15.9.2 Updates:
 - Hierarchy Blueprints and Channels
 - Pages introduced

Other Options

- Pages were introduced in 15.9.2 and provide the ability to build dashboard-like blueprints as a top-level menu option.
- Menu Links for quick links, commonly used links and/or shortcuts



Creating a Channel

1. Go into the New UI



2. Select Administration

3. Select Desired Blueprint


Creating a Channel cont.

4. Select Modules

Published: Jul 3, 2019 EDIT


5. Select Edit in the Upper Right Corner

6. Drag Channel to Page



Creating a Channel cont.

7. Put desired name and link into Channel. Some external sites might require a "Referrer URL" otherwise they might block the site from being visible.




8. Select Publish in the upper right

Dynamic Parameters in Channel URL

- Channels allow several parameters to be passed on to the URL, which extends the functionality.
- For example:
 - Rendering a Classic PPM Properties Page
 - External sites expecting a parameter, like a Power BI filtered report or similar.
- Parameters
 - Project Code: \${code}
 - INV INVESTMENTS.CODE (PRJ0001)
 - Project ID: \${internalID}
 - INV INVESTMENTS.ID (5000001)
 - Project Manager: \${manager}
 - SRM_RESOURCES.UNIQUE_NAME (jsmith)
 - User Name: \${userName}
 - SRM_RESOURCES.UNIQUE_NAME (jsmith) (User Logged In)
 - Project Name: \${name}
 - INV_INVESTMENTS.NAME (Application%20Monitoring)
 - Custom Fields (Number, String and Single Value Lookups (Static and NSQL))

Creating Channel to Project Tab

1) Go into any project in Classic PPM and copy url of desired page



2) Replace highlighted Internal ID with \${internalID}

- 3) If using Phoenix UI add &puiFullscreen=on at the end of url to remove menuinside channel.
- 4) Paste into channel URL and go into any project in the New UI and view result. Example on next page.

Part 3: Introduction to Pages

(new in 15.9.2)

Introduction to Pages


Pages provide a new, more robust option for linking to Clarity screens as well as external applications.

- Contain channels but no longer need to be tied to any object instance
- Supports custom attributes for passing parameters
- Includes a new studio object called "Page" (completely separate from Portlet Pages which still exist)
- Standard security rights are included for this new "Page" object so Pages can be editable, view-only or completely hidden based on need
- Pages are only available in the modern UX via a new icon




- "Page Navigate" security right needs to be granted
- Pages are associated with a Blueprint where Modules/Channels are defined (15 max)


Find the "Standard Page" Blueprint under Administration -> Blueprints:



Click on the 3 dots on the right-hand side and select COPY:



Rename the new Blueprint:




Move to the Modules tab and click "Edit"




Click "New Channel"



Name your Channel and paste in the URL




Drag the new Channel onto the Page, click "Publish"



Create Page

Navigate to Pages 🖵 and click on the blue "+"




Give it a Name, ID and select the Blueprint you just created




View Page – Classic UI

Click on your new Page to see the results!




View Page – Modern UX

After changing to the default UI to Phoenix and refreshing the page




Using Parameters in Page Channels


The Page object can be customized like any other Studio object. This allows you to create attributes to be used as input parameters in channel definitions.



Using Parameters in Page Channels #2

Here a string attribute called "Process Name" has been defined:






API Attribute ID is required and is used as the parameter name

Using Parameters in Page Channels #3

In this example a Module named Initiated Processes has been added to a Page Blueprint with the following Channel URL syntax:






Using Parameters in Page Channels #4

Pull up the Page associated with this Blueprint and enter some value in the

parameter "Process Name"





Part 4: Menu Links


So What Are Menu Links?

Menu Links are similar to Page Channels but more limited:


- Provide access to Clarity screens or other applications via a URL
- No blueprint support, only one "configurable" Menu Links page
- Supports grouping of links into Sections
- Security rights provided only at the Menu Links page level (all or nothing)
- Opens a new tab without modern UX "wrapper"

Create Menu Link

Navigate to Menu Links and click "New Link"




Enter the URL and a name for the Link, click "Done"



View Menu Link

Part 5: Considerations

Considerations

- Some external sites might not allow rendering inside of the new UX, this can either be:
 - Security limitations between sites that don't allow cross site rendering
 - Require a Referrer URLs to validate it is being called by an authorized or expected application
- Channels show duplicate menu unless you are using Phoenix UI
 - Rego has a Solution for this if you don't use the Phoenix UI. Talk to Josh Leone if you want to know more about Rego's Channel Pack
- To avoid hardcoding URLs when referencing the Classic UI the following notation can be used:



Considerations

	Channels	Pages	Menu Links
When to use	Embedding content inside the context of the object or hierarchy being displayed	High level dashboards. Multiple blueprints and instances using them can be created for multiple audiences	Quick links and shortcuts unrelated to PPM, which are opened in a new tab or window.
Limitations	Not all applications can be rendered inside a Channel	Not all applications can be rendered inside a Channel
