Standard or Sub-task issue *types* created for various purposes

## Package of Schemes: assign one of each to projects

(same package of schemes can be assigned to multiple projects - call it a "Project Scheme")

## **Issue Type Scheme**

Defined and limited set of issue types

Assigning an Issue Type Scheme to a project limits the issue types available to the Workflow Scheme, Issue Type Screen Scheme, and Field Configuration Scheme. Those schemes are then applied to the issue types available to the project through the Issue Type Scheme.

#### **Dependent Schemes**

#### **Workflow Scheme**

Set of Workflows (each with their set of statuses) and Workflow-to-issue type assignments (issue types available via the Issue Type Scheme)

## **Issue Type Screen Scheme**

Set of Screen Schemes (and their screen-to-operation mappings) and Screen Scheme-to-issue type assignments (issue types available via the Issue Type Scheme)

## **Field Configuration Scheme**

Set of Field Configurations and Field Configuration-to-issue type assignments (issue types available via the Issue Type Scheme)

#### **Independent Schemes**

## **Notification Scheme**

Set of notification rules

### **Permission Scheme**

Set of permission rules

## **Issue Security Scheme**

Set of issue-level security rules
