Pre-K classrooms are designed to support the cognitive, social emotional and academic development of the children. When designing the classroom layout, consider, safety, zones for learning, age-appropriate learning materials, appropriately sized chairs and tables, and accessible storage for learning materials.

Early learners learn through play and communication. The environment should spark their imagination, inviting learning through exploration and collaboration. Reconfigurable spaces are safe and secure and need to meet the demands of a dynamic and active environment. Use these questions to guide your classroom layout and furniture selection.
