

Website Privacy Policy

Your privacy is important to Make Philanthropy Work. Please read this privacy notice carefully as it contains important information on who we are, how and why we collect, store, use, and share personal information, your rights in relation to your personal information and on how to contact us and supervisory authorities in the event you have a complaint.

1. Who We Are

MPW Strategies, LLC (doing business as Make Philanthropy Work) collects, uses and is responsible for certain personal information about you.

2. Children's Online Privacy Protection Act

This website and any products and services offered herein are not intended for persons under the age of 13. Make Philanthropy Work does not knowingly collect information from anyone under 13 years of age. Make Philanthropy Work prohibits children under the age of 13 from using all interactive portions of this website, including leaving any comments, filling out forms, or otherwise submitting information. Make Philanthropy Work will not knowingly collect personally identifiable information from children under 13. If Make Philanthropy Work learns it has any information or content from anyone under the age of 13, it will delete that information.

3. The Personal Information We Collect and Use

a. *Information Collected by Us*

Make Philanthropy Work may collect, use, and is responsible for certain personal information that you provide when you voluntarily sign up for emails or free gifts, register for a class or presentation, leave comments, order a service or product, fill out any type of form, access private membership pages, or otherwise contact Make Philanthropy Work via an online form or email.. The information collected may include your name, email, address, phone number, organization name, and your title for that organization you represent, philanthropic areas of interest, and/or billing information. You are not required to provide any personally identifiable information to merely access or visit this website.

Make Philanthropy Work may collect domain information and "cookies" (small files saved on your hard drive by your web browser) to analyze website performance, track user patterns, save information from your previous visits and customize your experience.

If your browser sends a "Do Not Track" signal, only a generic cookie will be placed on your device while the website is accessed.

We will ask for your consent to allow us to use cookies. Make Philanthropy Work or its third-party vendors may collect non-personal information through the use of these technologies. Non-personal information might include the browser you use, the type of computer you use and technical information about your means of connection to this website such as the operating systems and the Internet service providers utilized and other similar information. Make Philanthropy Work's systems may also automatically gather information about the areas you visit and search terms you use on this website and about the links you may select from within this website to other areas of the Internet.

If you are located in the European Economic Area (EEA), we are regulated under the General Data Protection Regulation which applies across the European Union (including in the United Kingdom) and we are responsible as controller of that personal information for the purposes of those laws.

b. ***Information Collected from Other Sources***

We also obtain names and emails from other sources, such as Zoom and other webinar facilitation services.

c. ***How we use your personal information***

Make Philanthropy Work collects such information in order to send emails, fulfill orders, deliver services and products, complete customer transactions, oversee contests and promotions and improve website performance and customer service.

d. ***Who We Share Your Personal Information With***

Make Philanthropy Work respects your privacy and will never sell, trade or transfer your personally identifiable information to third parties (beyond what is necessary for fulfilling a customer transaction or for the basic functionality of an online service) without your consent.

Make Philanthropy Work may release personal information to enforce its Website Terms and Conditions of Use, other Terms and Conditions, manage its business, protect users or the general public, or to otherwise comply with legal obligations.

If you give Make Philanthropy Work your permission, it may also use personal identification information for internal or external marketing and promotional purposes.

On occasion, Make Philanthropy Work may collect personal identification information from you in connection with optional contests, special offers or promotions. Make Philanthropy Work will share such information with necessary third parties for the purpose of carrying out the contest, special offer or promotion. We will ask for your consent to such disclosure and use of such information, prior to your participation in the contest, special offer or promotion.

We will not share your personal information with any other third party.

e. ***Whether Information Has to Be Provided by You and Why***

The provision of personal data is required from you to enable us to direct your interests in our services or products. We do not require you to provide any personal data in order to view our website and much of our content open to the public. We will inform you when we collect it whether you are required to provide the information to us.

f. ***How Long Your Personal Information Will Be Kept***

We will hold personal data (e.g., name, address, and contact details) for six years. We will hold all non-client personal data until you let us know you would like for us to delete it or unsubscribe from our marketing contacts, which you are free to do at any time. We will hold all client and customer personal data in our files for six years.

g. ***Reasons We Can Collect and Use Your Personal Information***

Make Philanthropy Work collects and uses your personal information to send emails, fulfill orders, deliver services and products, complete customer transactions, oversee contests and promotions and improve website performance and customer service.

4. Use and Transfer of Your Information Out of the EEA

This website is operated in the United States and third parties with whom we might share your personal information as explained above are also located in the United States. If you are located in the EEA or elsewhere outside of the United States, please be aware that **any information you provide will be**

transferred to the United States. By using this website, participating in any of its services and/or providing your information, you consent to this transfer.

These countries do not have the same data protection laws as the United Kingdom and EEA. While the European Commission has not given a formal decision that the United States provide an adequate level of data protection similar to those which apply in the United Kingdom and EEA, any transfer of your personal information will be subject to the derogation in Article 49 permitting non-repetitive transfers that concern only a limited number of data subjects, as permitted by Article 49 of the General Data Protection Regulation that is designed to help safeguard your privacy rights and give you remedies in the unlikely event of a misuse of your personal information.

5. Your Rights

If you are covered by the General Data Protection Regulation, you have a number of important rights free of charge. In summary, those include rights to:

- Object at any time to processing of personal information concerning you for direct marketing
- Object to decisions being taken by automated means which produce legal effects concerning you or similarly significantly affect you
- Object in certain other situations to our continued processing of your personal information
- Otherwise restrict our processing of your personal information in certain circumstances

You may also have the right to claim compensation for damages caused by our breach of any data protection laws.
