Save time scrubbing through video and let Trint help you sequence your clips so you can spend time focusing on the creative and editorial process.


1. Transcribe your video


Upload your video to Trint and select your preferred settings including language and Workspaces.

Pro tip: upload a proxy file for faster transcriptions.

Find key soundbites

Find and highlight key time-coded soundbites in the Trint Editor. Here you can collaborate with team members to edit and verify the transcript. Use the playback feature to watch the video as the transcript unfolds or select *Play Highlights* to play the rough sequence only.













3. Export your file

You can export in a variety of formats including EDL, SRT and VTT. Select *Just Highlights* to export time-coded selects to Microsoft Word or a CSV file.






Open Adobe Premiere and in the *media window* right click to *import* your full res video and your EDL file. Select your *video standard.*



5. Link up your files

In the *media window,* right click to select *Link Media* then *Locate files* to connect your EDL files with your full res video.

Your video is now sequenced in Adobe!
