We will be wrapping up our third round of vaccination clinics in March. TCU is being held on March 8, and WWRI, Memory Care and Care Suites will be held on March 13. We currently do not have the ability to administer any vaccines after these dates. The MDH is working on plans for communities to be able to administer vaccines to new residents and employees, as well as second doses to those that started the vaccination process. We will update you as we learn more. We are pleased that 98% of our residents are vaccinated in WWRI, Memory Care and Care Suites! Our current numbers show that 56% of employees are also vaccinated. Please note that we are not changing any infection control practices currently as there is still too much to learn regarding reinfection, how long the vaccine lasts, etc. The MDH has not loosened the guidance for congregate care settings at this time. Please continue to wear a mask, complete good hand hygiene, and social distance. As changes occur from the CDC and MDH, we will keep you posted and adjust as we go. We will continue to do everything we can to resume "normalcy" with increased visitation, group activities and dining. Thank you for your ongoing patience as we endure this pandemic together!
