

Implementing OER resources to lower course material costs EASIER THAN YOU THINK!


Student affordability initiatives continue to gain momentum and OER (Open Educational Resource) materials are a significant part of these efforts.

Make sure the content is peer reviewed for academic rigor, quality and accuracy.

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Think about customization:

There are many providers, including XanEdu, who can take vour requirements and build a customized set of materials directly aligned to your course goals. When these materials are based on OER resources, the costs will remain low.
