NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT TECH/IPAD TRAINING

HEALTH FORMS IN MAGNUS

Tampa Prep is in the process of updating required student forms and beginning the transition to MyTampaPrep, our new student information system. Additionally, the FHSAA has informed us that they are updating the EL-2 and EL-3 forms for the 2021-22 school year. All required forms will be available later in the summer on your student's Magnus Health account. You will receive an email detailing any changes that have been made, and instructions on how to complete all of the necessary forms.

Physicals are still able to be updated in Magnus. The EL-2 (Physical) form that is in your student's Magnus account will be accepted until the new form is released by the FHSAA. You can access the blank EL-2 through your student's Magnus account or at this link. Once completed, please upload the form to your student's Magnus account. Student physicals are current for 365 days. The expiration date of your student's physical can be found on their Magnus account.











THIS IS WHAT WE WILL LEARN Students in 6th Grade Band Class will work, towards developing the following skills:


- Students will work towards developing good to production on a wind instrument

- "Learning Well" is not the same as "Learning Fast". Consequently, the decision to advance a student in the mathematics sequence is taken with great care.
- "Skipping" or "Advancing" a course may cause gaps in the student's knowledge. Those gaps may not become apparent until a year or two later when that topic is necessary to master a new concept or answer a SAT question.
- Consideration is given to the student's maturity, ability to handle the increased pressure and comfort level in being an active participant in a classroom with older students.
- Each decision is personal and made with input from the student, family, teacher and administration.


