The completion of Highway 287 replaced the old Lincoln Highway (111th St.) as the main route from Denver to Boulder. The Lions Club of Boulder, under the guidance of President Louis Herman, wanted to mark the new route as well as wishing to memorialize those who had served in WWI. On 21 December 1927 the Gateway was adopted as a major activity and plans were initiated by Lion Mead Walter. The cornerstone was laid 18 April 1928.

A rumor that a horned toad would be put in the cornerstone brought nation wide attention to the club. State humane society officers came to the rescue of the ill-fated creature, but no amphibian was found to exist.

In May of 1928, the Gateway was completed at the cost of \$1600.00. In June the international president of the Lions Club, Irving L. Camp, presided over the dedication.

Highway 287 became a secondary road with the completion of the Boulder-Denver Turnpike in 1952. Since then the purpose of the Road to Remembrance Gateway has been all but forgotten, yet its prominence on the Eastern plains of the county lends to its credence as a historical site.
