The principal activity of the Company is to carry on the business of a computer software house. The Company obtained Multimedia Super Corridor ("MSC") status in 1997. There has been no significant change in the nature of this principal activity during the financial year.

The holding company is Ramco Systems Ltd., a company incorporated in India.

These financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 17 April 2015.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies are adopted by the Company and are consistent with those adopted in previous years.

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared on the historical cost basis except as disclosed in the notes to the financial statements and in compliance with Private Entity Reporting Standards and the requirements of the Companies Act, 1965 in Malaysia.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.2 Equipment

Equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Depreciation

The straight-line method is used to write off the cost of the following assets over the terms of their estimated useful lives at the following principal annual rates:

Computer	20%
Software	33.3%
Office equipment, furniture and fittings	20%

Gain and loss arising from disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of asset, and is recognised in the income statement.

1.3 Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are stated at cost less allowance for doubtful debts.

1.4 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with licensed banks. For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of pledged deposits.

1.5 Liabilities

Trade and other payables are stated at cost.

1.6 Employee Benefits

(i) Short-term employee benefits

Wages, salaries and bonuses are recognised as expenses in the year in which the associated services are rendered by the employees of the Company. Short-term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences, and short-term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick leave are recognised when the absences occur.

(ii) Statutory Employer's contribution

Obligations for contributions to statutory pension funds are recognised as an expense in the income statement as incurred.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.7 Impairment

The carrying amounts of assets, other than financial assets, are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset or the cash-generating unit to which it belongs exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in the income statement.

The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and its value in use. In assessing value in use, estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. For an asset that does not generate largely independent cash inflows, the recoverable amount is determined for the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount and it is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss has been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement.

1.8 Income tax

Tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognised in the income statement.

Current tax expense is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is provided, using the balance sheet method, on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Temporary differences are not recognised for the initial recognition of assets or liabilities that at the time of the transaction affects neither accounting nor taxable profit. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realisation or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

A deferred tax asset is recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the asset can be utilised.

1.9 Provisions

A provision is recognised when it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event and a reliable estimate can be made of this amount.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.10 Foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated to Ringgit Malaysia ("RM") at rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at the foreign exchange rates ruling at that date. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the income statement.

The closing rates used in the translation of foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are as follows:

1 USD: RM 3.68 (2014: RM3.31) 1 INR: RM 0.05 (2014: RM0.05)

1.11 Revenue

Software sales, service and maintenance

(i) License fees

License fees revenue is recognised on delivery of the software.

(ii) Implementation fee

Implementation contracts are either milestones based or time and material based:

- (a) In the case of milestones contract, revenue is recognised based on efforts spent and upon achievement of the milestones as per the terms of the contract.
- (b) In the case of time and material contracts, revenue is recognised based on billable time spent on the project, priced at the contractual rate.

(iii) Services

Revenue from fixed price contracts is recognised on milestones achieved as per the terms of the specific contract and based on efforts spent.

(iv) Annual maintenance contract

Revenue from maintenance services is recognised on a pro-rata basis over the period of the contract.

(v) Hardware Sales
