3 Important Updates for Supercluster Project Applicants

As of January 2020, NGen has allocated over 80% of our first tranche of Supercluster funding in support of advanced manufacturing projects. We are currently negotiating a recapitalization and extension of NGen funding with the Federal Government and hope to report good news on that front soon.

1. Project Application Deadlines

Only project applications that are fully compliant and have submitted all required documentation prior to these deadlines will be eligible for assessment by NGen's panels of independent experts. Applications that are incomplete or that do not meet the assessment deadlines outlined below are invited to submit their applications for consideration before the next deadline. Resources to support the development of high-quality applications will be made available through workshops on the following dates.

3. Cash Advances to Projects

NGen's funding model is based on a quarterly reimbursement of eligible costs. NGen has reserved a limited amount of funds for cash advances available to SME's. NGen intends to maximize the distribution of advances among the largest number of SME's as possible. As such, these funds are available on a first come, first served basis upon completing the contracting phase of the project application.
