Day 1:

- Meet your Tour Director and board your private motor coach.
- Explore the history of the Revolutionary War when you climb the Bunker Hill Monument, one of the first monuments in the United States. Dive deeper into the battle's history at the Bunker Hill Museum.
- After lunch, depart for Salem and Marblehead.
- Experience the spookier side of American history at the Salem Witch Museum. In its main exhibit, 13 stage sets use historic documents to bring to life the Salem Witch Trials of 1692. A secondary exhibit guides you through the history and changing interpretations of witchcraft.
- Visit the House of Seven Gables, a famous 17th-century estate that inspired Nathaniel Hawthorne's famous Gothic novel of the same name.
- After dinner, explore more haunted hotspots on a nighttime Salem Ghost Tour.

Day 2:

- "Walk into history" on the **Freedom Trail**. Costumed tour guides take you along a 2.5-mile route featuring 16 revolutionary locations.
- Join the revolution at the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum, an interactive history experience.
- Explore the **Museum of Science**. Established in 1830 as the Boston Society of Natural History, the museum features diverse exhibits and an indoor zoo.
- Enjoy the sweeping 360° views of the city from the Prudential Center Skywalk Observatory.
- Head to historic Fenway Park, the oldest baseball stadium in the country, for a Boston Red Sox game. (Seasonal, pending home schedule)

Day 3:

- Travel to Plimoth Plantation, a living history museum that recreates the colonial settlement. Learn not just about the newly-arrived settlers, but also about Native American tribes and customs in the area.
- Board the Mayflower II, a full-scale reproduction that illuminates the harrowing journey the Pilgrims braved in 1620.
- Learn more about the 35th President of the United States during a visit to the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum. Exhibits feature artifacts from his campaign and inauguration, the "Space Race," and gifts from international heads of state.
- After dinner, take in a performance of Shear Madness, a longrunning comedy that has been seen by over 12 million people.
 Set in a hair salon, the crowd participates to solve a humorous whodunit.

Day 4:

- Head to the towns of **Lexington and Concord**, sites of the first military battles during the American Revolution.
- See where the Revolutionary War began at Lexington Common, explore more revolutionary battlefields at Minute Man National Historic Park, step inside the life of the author of Little Women at the Louisa May Alcott House, tour an 18th century gathering place at Buckman Tavern, and more.
- Take a panoramic tour of **Harvard** and the **Massachussetts Institute of Technology** aboard your private motor coach.
