QUÉBEC CITY, MONTRÉAL & OTTAWA - 7 Days | Canada's History Student Tour

DAY 1

11:00 a.m. Arrive in Montréal then transfer to your motor coach and depart for Québec City.

3:00 p.m. Orientation Walk of Upper Town. Experience the city as it was in the days of New France. Your Tour Leader will guide you through the upper half of the UNESCO World Heritage Site to see Cannon Ball Tree, Rue du Trésor, or Artist Alley, and the iconic Château Frontenac.

5:00 p.m. Hotel check-in

6:30 p.m. **Dinner**

7:30 p.m. La Chasse: The Hunt for Champlain's Remains.
Your students will become amateur sleuths as
they try to uncover the lost remains of Samuel de
Champlain. Learn about the real-life events that led
to the disappearance of Champlain's burial site as you
explore Québec City with your Tour Leader.

10:00 p.m. Night security each evening between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

DAY 2

8:30 a.m. Breakfast

10:00 a.m. Sound and light presentation at Musée du
Fort. Watch as the Musée du Fort takes you on an
extraordinary journey in time with a sound and light
show that recounts the military history of Québec
City. Make sure you pay attention, after the show you
will take part in our interactive game for a chance to
win a prize!

10:45 a.m. Orientation Walk of Lower Town. Experience the city as it was in the days of New France. Your Tour Leader will guide your through the lower half of the UNESCO World Heritage Site to see the Place Royal, and Fresque du Petit-Champlain.

11:45 a.m. **Explore Old Québec.** In small groups you will visit rue du Trésor, the street of artists, and the many shops and boutiques. Lunch at your own cost.

2:30 p.m. Guided tour of the Citadelle/Royal 22e Régiment Museum. Built by the British following the war of 1812, La Citadelle is the fortress home of the Royal 22e Régiment. A guided tour introduces students to the Citadelle's history and that of the "Vandoos".

6:00 p.m. French Canadian Dinner at Érablière du Lac
Beauport. Enjoy a traditional sugar shack meal
followed by lively folk music, dancing and maple
taffy served on snow. You will also visit the maple
sugar museum and the trapper camp where you will
learn about the ancient and modern techniques of
Québec trappers.

7:00 p.m. Evening Walk, Bonfire and Marshmallows. Wander through a forest of over 10,000 maple trees in the Maple Sugar Bush, followed by an evening bonfire where students will relax and roast marshmallows.

DAY 3

7:00 a.m. Breakfast

7:45 a.m. Check out of your hotel

8:15 a.m. **Quel Beau Pré!** Explore the route to Nouvelle France and the people that inhabited the coast throughout history. As you drive along this historic coastline, your students will learn about a few of the important figures that once called this area home.

9:00 a.m. Self-Guided Visit of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré
Basilica. Discover the Romanesque cathedral that
began as a shrine to honour Saint Anne. Every year
hundreds of thousands of tourists and pilgrims
visit this impressive church where miracles are still
believed to occur.

10:30 a.m. Workshop at the Albert Gilles Copper Museum.
Visit the exhibition of 50 hand-wrought silver panels,
executed by the internationally renowned artisan,
Albert Gilles. After, experience the technique of
"repoussé" with a hands-on workshop resulting in
pieces students can take home.

11:30 a.m. Board your motor coach and depart for Montréal.
3:00 p.m. Montréal Science Centre. Enjoy a trip to the a vast interactive science complex that allows visitors to discover the major scientific and technological secrets of our time.

5:00 p.m. Old Montréal Orientation Tour. Your Tour Leader will guide you through Old Montréal to learn about this historic district. Students will see the historic Notre Dame Basilica, Place Jacques-Cartier and oldest skyscraper in Canada, the New York Life Insurance Building.

6:00 p.m. Dinner

DAY 4

7:45 a.m. Breakfast

9:00 a.m. Biodome and Olympic Tower. Enjoy the cable car ride up to the Olympic Park Observatory and the Biodome. The Olympic Park is made up of the Stadium, the Montréal Tower the Sports Centre, the fields and the outside grounds.

12:30 p.m. **Explore Old Montréal.** Free time to shop and explore the cobblestone streets of Old Montréal. Lunch at your own cost.

2:30 p.m. Visit and Intro Tour of the Notre Dame Basilica.
Situated in the heart of Old Montréal, Notre Dame is an architectural masterpiece. Students will learn the history of the basilica as they marvel at the gorgeous paintings, sculptures and stained glass.

3:30 p.m. Guided Tour of Pointe-à-Callière Museum. The archaeology museum of Montréal looks at the history of the region dating back thousands of years.

5:30 p.m. Dinner

6:00 p.m. Quilles G Plus le Forum. Enjoy two games of cosmic bowling at where you can dust off your bowling shoes and get ready for the good times to roll.

DAY 5

8:00 a.m. Breakfast

8:30 a.m. Check out of your hotel

9:30 a.m. Mount Royal Lookout. The group will head up to the top of Mount Royal to get a bird's eye view of the city. From the lookout, students will get a great view of the Saint Lawrence River and the Monteregian Hills - the perfect place for pictures!

10:30 a.m. Board your motor coach and depart for Ottawa. 1:00 p.m. The Byward Market. Time to have lunch on your own and explore one of Canada's oldest and largest public markets. Lieutenant Colonel John By, builder of the Rideau Canal, laid out the plan for the market, which features museums, cafes, specialty food shops,

restaurants and more.

2:00 p.m. Discover Bytown. Explore Ottawa's past and present with your Tour Leader as you walk through the important historical landmarks of our capital. Students will discover the dubious history of Bytown as they are guided through the streets of the Byward Market, walk along the Rideau Canal, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, see the National War Memorial, and visit the steps of Parliament Hill.

4:30 p.m. Hotel check-in

6:00 p.m. Dinner

7:30 p.m. Haunted Jail Tour. Visit death row and the gallows inside the Old Carleton County Jail and other haunted locations for a haunted tour of Ottawa while your tour guide recounts supernatural encounters.

DAY 6

8:00 a.m. Breakfast

9:30 a.m. Legislate This! Join your Tour Leader on Parliament Hill to learn how a bill becomes a law. Students will debate a sample piece of legislature during the mock parliament and will discover the processes that MPs experience as they vote in new legislation. This Brightspark Exclusive is a fun game that ties perfectly into the curriculum.

10:30 a.m. Visit the Canadian War Museum. Wander through the halls to see the museum's award-winning architecture, its collection of war art and its large military vehicles. This stunning structure, on the banks of the Ottawa River, houses the largest military history collection in Canada and spans the period from The Seven Years' War to the present.

12:30 p.m. Rideau Centre. Enjoy lunch on your own with more than a dozen places to eat. After lunch, the students may be permitted some time to explore the mall.

2:30 p.m. Canadian Museum of History. Visit to see Canada's most popular and most visited museum. Journey through 1000 years of Canada's history in life-size settings and experience the richness of Canada's past.

6:30 p.m. Brightspark Evening Gala. After a delicious buffet dinner, students will party the night away at Lago, with gorgeous views of Dows Lake, and experience our interactive dance party and photo booth.

10:00 a.m. Self-guided Visit of the National Gallery of Canada. See paintings and sculptures from around the world, including works by Picasso, Van Gogh, Warhol, the Group of Seven, and more.

11:15 a.m. Sussex Drive Coach Tour. Drive along the iconic Sussex Drive as your Tour Leader comments on points of interest. These include the residences of the Prime Minister, the Governor General and a number of foreign embassies.

11:30 a.m. Guided Tour of RCMP Rockcliffe Stables. A behindthe-scenes look at the facility where our famous mounted police and their beautiful horses train for their trademark musical rides. See where the horses are groomed and learn about the history of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

12:00 p.m. Board your motor coach and depart for the airport for your flight home!
