## **NEW ORLEANS -** 5 Days | Magic of Music Tour

### DAY 1

7:00 a.m. Board your flight to New Orleans.

11:45 a.m. Arrive at New Orleans Airport. Your Tour Leader will meet you at the airport. Board your motor coach for your transfer to the city centre.

2:00 p.m. Blain Kern's Mardi Gras World Tour. See where the magic is made! Blain Kern Studios creates amazing floats and Carnival sculptures, weaving spells of wonder.

4:00 p.m. Hotel check-in

6:00 p.m. Dinner

7:00 p.m. French Quarter Ghosts and Legends Tour. Discover New Orleans' darker side on this haunted history ghost tour. Tales of famous hauntings and eerie locations will make this a very exciting evening.

#### DAY 2

8:00 a.m. Breakfast

10:00 a.m. Jean Lafitte Swamp Tour. Head to the bayou for a real-life swamp adventure! You will see live alligators and other wildlife as you glide through swamps lined with moss-draped cypress trees.

1:00 p.m. Visit the French Quarter, the oldest section of New Orleans. Founded in 1718 by Jean-Baptiste Le Moyne de Bienville, the city developed around the Vieux Carré, the original central square.

1:30 p.m. Lunch

**3:00 p.m. Performance Opportunity.** Showcase your talent as you perform at a venue selected specially for your group.

6:00 p.m. Dinner

8:00 p.m. Concert at Preservation Hall. Originally built as a private residence in 1750, Preservation Hall opened its doors in 1961 as a sanctuary to protect and honour New Orleans Jazz, which had lost much of its popularity to modern jazz and rock 'n' roll.

### DAY 3

8:30 a.m. Breakfast

10:30 a.m. Visit the Audubon Aquarium of the Americas. Penguins, sea otters, sea horses and dragons, a Caribbean reef, and even a white alligator can be found at this incredible site. A must-see for any lover of aquatic life!

12:30 p.m. Lunch

**3:30 p.m. Music Workshop.** Join a specialist in the faculty of music at one of New Orleans' universities and watch your group hone its skills.

6:00 p.m. Creole Queen Dinner Jazz Cruise. Enjoy the evening as you cruise the mighty Mississippi. The sounds of New Orleans jazz will fill the air as you partake of a lavish dinner. Admire the twinkling skyline of New Orleans as you sip your favourite beverage on the Promenade deck.

### DAY 4

8:00 a.m. Breakfast

10:00 a.m. Visit the New Orleans Museum of Art. An exquisite pearl set inside City Park's gorgeous natural landscape, the New Orleans Museum of Art is the city's oldest fine arts institution. The permanent collection contains more than 40,000 objects and is noted for its French and American art.

11:30 a.m. Discover the Sydney and Walda Besthoff Sculpture
Garden. The gorgeous grounds surrounding the Museum
of Art hold more than 90 sculptures. These incredible
works of art are nestled within a landscape of magnolias,
pines, and oaks surrounding two lagoons. Explore to your
heart's delight.

1:30 p.m. Cooking Demonstration and Lunch. A chef will demonstrate cooking techniques at the New Orleans School of Cooking. Watch French cuisine being created before you sit down and enjoy it for lunch!

3:30 p.m. Visit the New Orleans Jazz Museum in the Old U.S. Mint. Louis Armstrong's cornet, Fats Domino's piano, and Sidney Bechet's soprano sax are only some of the instruments on display. Celebrate the history of jazz in the city in which it was born.

5:00 p.m. Explore the French Market. Founded in 1791, the oldest market in America spans six blocks in the French Quarter. You can find everything from jewelry, arts and crafts, and apparel to souvenirs, confectionery, and food vendors. Make sure you have a beignet before you leave!

**6:00 p.m. Live Music and Dinner at Mulate's.** The original Cajun restaurant will not disappoint!
