Make sure you pay attention, after the show you will take part in our interactive game for a chance to win a prize!
- **12:15 PM: Explore Old Québec.** In small groups you will visit rue du Trésor, the street of artists, and the many shops and boutiques. Lunch at your own cost.
- **3:00 PM: Guided Tour at the Traditional Huron Site -Onhoüa Chetek8e.** Journey into the heart of Huron traditions, where students will discover their ancient way of life on a guided tour of the reconstructed Huron Village. Visit a longhouse and learn about the transportation, food preparation and spirituality of the Huron-Wendat people.
- **6:00 PM: French Canadian Dinner at Érablière du Lac Beauport.** Enjoy a traditional sugar shack meal followed by lively folk music, dancing and maple taffy served on snow. You will also visit the maple sugar museum and the trapper camp where you will learn about the ancient and modern techniques of Québec trappers.
- 7:00 PM: Evening Walk, Bonfire and Marshmallows. Wander through a forest of over 10,000 maple trees in the Maple Sugar Bush, followed by an evening bonfire where students will relax and roast marshmallows.

DAY 3

7:00 AM: Breakfast 7:45 AM: Check out of your hotel

- 8:15 AM: Quel Beau Pré! Explore the route to Nouvelle France and the people that inhabited the coast throughout history. As you drive along this historic coastline, your students will learn about a few of the important figures that once called this area home.
- **9:00 AM: Self-Guided Visit of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré Basilica.** Discover the Romanesque cathedral that began as a shrine to honour Saint Anne. Every year hundreds of thousands of tourists and pilgrims visit this impressive church where miracles are still believed to occur.
- **10:15 AM: Visit Montmorency Falls.** Stop at one of the most spectacular natural wonders of the Beaupré Coast, Montmorency Falls! Students will explore the top and bottom of the falls and the brave can get photos from the middle of a suspension bridge spanning the top of the falls.

11:00 AM: Board your motor coach and depart for Montréal

- **3:00 PM: Biodome and Olympic Tower.** Enjoy the cable car ride up to the Olympic Park Observatory and the Biodome. The Olympic Park is made up of the Stadium, the Montréal Tower, the Sports Centre, the fields and the outside grounds.

- **6:00 PM: Old Montréal Orientation Tour.** Your Tour Leader will guide you through Old Montréal to learn about this historic district. Students will see Notre Dame Basilica, Place Jacques-Cartier and the oldest skyscraper in Canada, the New York Life Insurance Building.

- **10:00 AM: Guided Tour of Pointe-à-Callière Museum.** The archaeology museum of Montréal looks at the history of the region dating back thousands of years.
- **11:30 AM: Explore Old Montréal.** Free time to shop and explore the cobblestone streets of Old Montréal. Lunch on your own.
- **1:00 PM: Montréal Science Centre.** Enjoy a trip to the a vast interactive science complex that allows visitors to discover the major scientific and technological secrets of our time.
- **3:00 PM: Saint Joseph's Oratory.** The dome is second in height only to that of St Peter's Basilica in Rome. Learn of its history on this self-guided tour.
- **4:00 PM: Mount Royal Lookout.** The group will head up to the top of Mount Royal to get a bird's eye view of the city. From the lookout, students will get a great view of the Saint Lawrence River and the Monteregian Hills the perfect place for pictures!

7:30 PM: Haunted Jail Tour. Visit death row and the gallows inside the Old Carleton County Jail and other haunted locations for a haunted tour of Ottawa while your tour guide recounts supernatural encounters.

- 12:15 PM: Niagara Parkway Orientation Driving Tour. Get ready for a drive down one of the oldest roads in Ontario! With gorgeous views along the way to the Horseshoe Falls, your Tour Leader will guide you as you travel down the historic Niagara Parkway.
- **12:30 PM: Floral Clock.** Do you have the time? The Floral Clock, along the Niagara Parkway, is the largest of its kind in the world and features over 24,000 colourful plants. This is the perfect place for a group photo or fun selfie with friends.
- **1:00 PM: Clifton Hill.** Explore the main strip of Niagara Falls where you will find restaurants, souvenir shops, wax museums and fun houses.

- 2:30 PM: Imax Film at the IMAX Theatre in Niagara Falls. Ever wondered what it would be like to ride over Niagara Falls?
