

## **ESSER Funding Cheat Sheet**

Q: Where can I get a basic overview of the three different types of ESSER Funds (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief)—CARES, CRRSA and ARP?

A. The office of Elementary & Secondary Education has an up-to-date page that gives a brief overview of the three different infusions to ESSER. <u>Visit the ESSER Page</u>

Q: What resource can I view to determine if my state has submitted a plan for obtaining our funding and what stage that plan is in?

A. This page lists all states/territories and reflects the state's status in obtaining funding, it is updated regularly. <u>Visit the State Plans Page</u>

Q: Where can I find the total amount of stimulus funding my school district has been allocated and already spent?

- A. There are a few different resources you can check. In our opinion, these two sites are not only the easiest to navigate, but also contain the most accurate information.
  - Visit the Education Stabilization Fund Page to view how much funding has been awarded and how much has been spent by your state and even your district. In the section marked Funds Awarded, choose the Awarded or Spent Tab, then choose your state. First you will see an overview, to see your district's details click on the link below the overview labeled, "Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund". Once the link opens, you can find your district listed alphabetically below.
  - 2. <u>Visit Budget Challenge's ESSER Funding Map.</u> This is a little quicker to navigate than the Department of Ed site, and the information is accurate so far but do keep in mind it is only a resource and not an official government site.
