## EASTER BUNNY BASKET

Would dogs eat the Easter Bunny? Of course not. Instead, we swapped in cage-free non-Easter rabbits and eggs from quails (not holiday hares) in this meaty treaty dog dream of an Easter basket.

### INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 2 Quail eggs\* or one hard-boiled chicken egg
- 2 small carrots
- 1 rabbit ear
- 1/4 C frozen rabbit patties
- 1/4 C pumpkin puree
- Large or small Tux®

### DIRECTIONS

1. Place the eggs in Tux and fill the rest with rabbit meat.
2. Add the rabbit ears, pumpkin puree and carrots.
3. Put in the freezer for an hour or two, and serve for Easter brunch.
