Ingredients




- 3 cup flour (extra optional)
- 3/4 cup salt
- 5 tbsp cream of tartar
- Measuring cups/spoons
- Non-stick sheet pan
- Paper bag/newspaper
- Mulch, potting soil, dirt, small rocks, pea gravel, or bird seed
- 3 tbsp vegetable oil
- 3 cups of water
- Food coloring (optional)
- Large pot
- Spatula
- Paper Towel
- Construction trucks and toys

CONSTRUCTION SITE PLAY DOUGH







- 1. Lightly coat a non-stick sheet pan with flour and set aside.
- 2. Add the flour, salt, cream of tartar, vegetable oil, and water into a large pot. Stir the ingredients on medium heat. Add any food coloring as the ingredients start to thicken. To make a brown color, use 15 drops red, 15 drops yellow and 3 drops blue. You can add more for your desired color.
- 3. Continue stirring the ingredients until it gets thick and starts to form a ball.
- 4. Remove the ball of play dough from the pan and lay it on the floured sheet pan. Be sure to allow the dough to cool.
- 5. Knead the dough until it is smooth. Try to remove any air pockets out of the dough.
- 6. Once the dough is smooth, it is ready to form into objects. For this activity, break up the dough and roll into balls to look like a boulder. Read step 7 before you start this step.
- 7. If you want to add some texture to your play dough, consider mixing in mulch, potting soil, dirt, small rocks, pea gravel, or bird seed.
- 8. Bring out construction trucks to play with your dough. When done playing with the dough, store in an airtight container in a cool location and store up to a couple weeks.
