





# THE POWER OF PERSPECTIVE

Categorization (i.e., to organize ideas or objects into a part-whole system) can lead to costly thinking errors. The problem is that every category is based on one implicit perspective but there are many perspectives possible. Change your perspective and you change how the part-whole system gets organized.



These eight shapes can be grouped in different ways depending on perspective. View the examples below to see how many more possibilities you can find.
