Invoice the Council!

Now you've finished your presentation, it's time to invoice the council for your hard work.

Open Microsoft Excel and click 'blank workbook'. In box A1 type the name of your local area and Presentation (e.g. Somerset Presentation). In box A2 type 'Photos' and in box B2 type £10. In box A3 type Presentation and in box B3 type £20. In box A4 type Total and in box B4 type =sum(B2+B3) and press enter. Your invoice total will be automatically calculated! You can change the prices in box B2 and B3 and the total in box B4 will automatically change- have a go!
