





Culture as a First Necessity Investment

- The world culture has many usages, not much clarity.
- Culture as agent for changes notably to question technology progress, to nourish innovation, to foster solidarities and empathies.







Culture, a Driver of Political & Technological Transformation

- Culture influences political transformation whether to nourish collective passions or to be critical of political orders (that deny freedom of expression for instance).
- It shapes our values in relation to powerful disruptive technology (genetic, data processing...).
- Culture is everywhere nourishing territorial attractiveness (talent, tourism, real estate, investment), innovation (digital economy), social cohesion and well-being. Cultural investment is multidimensional.

Towards a Modern Cultural Policy

- Cultural policy to adapt to a new world

 more urbanized, connected, driven by technology and engineering.
- Cultural agents have special skills and competence to steer new enlightenment and collective will, to imagine the future beyond survival or bureaucratic efficiency.
- Culture as a resource to protect from standardization trends, to challenge technology, progress to empower communities, to nurture solidarities across culture.

- Mobilise culture agents to drive global cooperation and solidarities.
- Acknowledge acceleration of behavioural changes (future generation).
- **Adapt** policies to the digital shift (scale and international).
